At least two saints made their apostolate there with the one sent by Pope Clement I, St. Auspicus who died as a martyr in 102 AD, and St. Castor. There used to be a cathedral there where three sees of Provence decided to offer 11 days of indulgence for those who will visit and pray during the exaltation of the Cross. There used to be a cathedral there dedicated to St. Anne which was only completed in 1056, a second one. The town used to have the fourth largest community of Jews in the whole of France.

He was stabbed to death by Charlotte Gray while in the herb bath to improve his inflammatory-deteriorating skin condition.

This man is Jacques Pierre Brissot de Warville, is the Girondist leader in the national assembly. As leaders of the Girondins, he represented the merchants, and the financiers making him an easy target of the peasants who hate moneyed people. He pursued a constitutional monarchy and supported the Montagnards, the radicals who would supply the needs of the urban class. Girondins are also called Brissotins because of his influence. He influenced France's declaring war against Austria, which initially was disastrous for the French, such that he was arrested along with other Brissotins to be guillotined in October of the same year of the war.

This is Georges-Jacques Danton who is the founder of the Club des Cordeliers and the Committee of Public Safety. As Minister of Justice, his September 2 speech fueled the September massacre against which the Girondins opposed the use of force. He was accused by Robespierre as a counter-revolutionary and was guillotined on April 5, 1799. His group of Jacobins, the Mountain, is so-called because they occupy the highest gallery seats in the assembly. Robespierre is also a Jacobin who betrayed him to gain his power.

This man is Maximillian Francois Marie-Isidore de Robespierre who is a provincial lawyer who became the leader of the Jacobins. This political party overthrew the Girondists in 1793. As member of the committee of Public Safety he virtually became the dictator of France ridding all resistance by launching the Reign of Terror. His acts based on the philosophy of Rousseau became extremely extremist. A megalomaniac, he established a Cult of the Supreme Being based on deism and nationalism. He was overthrown in a coup in the Thermidor of 1794.

I'm a little bit confused, \_said Fr. Les Saintes, \_What are Jacobins? Cult or political party?

It's a political party rival to the Girondist. It takes its name from Dominican Friars which used to occupy the former Dominican monastery where the former Versailles deputies met as a club led by Robespierre to become a radically political party. \_said the mystic, \_ though he started a cult, the Jacobins does not refer to this. He must have misunderstood Jean- Jacques Rousseau whose social contract does not go to extremities because he only wanted to give some of his ideal man's self as a contribution to society and not necessarily an uncontrolled everything. Even Francoise Marie Arouet Voltaire did not push for a revolutionary proletariat but rather an ungoverned man of the middle class.

Yes, let me just have the rundown of the relevant French kings so that we will

understand things about French monarchy better,\_ said Father Caluag, and waved his hand for a new set of visions.

This is Saint Louis IX. As King he made a generous peace with King of Aragon in 1258 and then with the King of England in 1259. He extended royal authority and strengthened central administration. The governance of taxation and justice system was greatly improved. As leader of the seventh and eight crusades, he was captured by the Muslims in the former and while setting out in the latter, died in Tunis. Being pious, ascetic and just, he was the embodiment of the medieval ideal of a Christian King. If some of you were with me in my readings on eucharistic miracles, he was the King who wasn't even surprised at all when told that the Child Jesus was seen in the Eucharist, \_annotated Fr. Frank, \_He just knew he ought to be there. He gave France unprecedented prosperity and peace. His fame was such that he became arbiter in European affairs. He was canonized in 1297 with his feast day on August 25.

Second in our consideration is this man, Louis XIV, "the great" otherwise known as 'le Roi Soleil' or the Sun King. After the regency of his mother, he started a personal rule in1661. In a series of wars, France extended its territory but was left financially exhausted. His persecution of the protestants led to the revocation in 1685, of the Edict of Nantes as advised by his Minister of War, Francois Michel Louvois which led to the mass flights of Huguenots from France and consequently the loss of his Protestant allies. His court, in the palace he built in Versailles was never surpassed in its standard as being the most magnificent. He had several mistresses who tried to outdo each other for his attention and he had been gallant and patronizing to them for some time. He however, has overlooked how the French poor lived and seemed without compassion for their plight. Served by great men, especially Colbert, in financial affairs, Louvois, in military matters and Vauban in fortifications his patronage of the arts and literature realized a classical ideal for humankind.

This man is King Louis XV is the great grandson of Louis XIV. Under the regency of Philippe, Duke of Orleans, and under the ministry of Fleury, trade flourished until the War of Polish Succession in which France gained Lorraine. The War of Austrian succession brought no gains while the Seven Years war resulted to the loss of French overseas territories. The King's policies were greatly influenced by his two mistresses, Madame de Pompadour and Madame du Barry. The financial strain of the wars and the excesses of the courts especially by the king and his mistresses alienated the growing number of intellectuals.

From the preceding three kings, we may now consider the time that this man became King, Louis XVI, grandson of Louis XV. Already hard up with the problems he inherited, he even was generous as to assist the Americans in their unstable rise to self-governance. His finance ministers Turgot and Necker, were not able to save the French government from financial and political collapse. All attempts for reform were thwarted by the spoiled nobility. French intervention in the American revolutionary war brought bankruptcy and for the first time after 1614 the States General was summoned in 1789. This was the propitious time awaited by the Freemasons and soon the royal family became virtual prisoners in Paris. A constitutional monarchy would have been made a

solution as proposed by Olymphe de Gouges, a pioneer feminist and revolutionist, as she even proposed to defend him in his trial, but the revolutionists greedy for power, deposed him and had him guillotined, \_he concluded the visions on the kings.

Now, this is the Marquis de Lafayette. You must be familiar with him as the French Commander who fought side by side in America's war for independence. An adventurer, the French King completely trusted him and sent him in a very expensive involvement in the American war for independence. Here, he is seen writing with Emmanuel Joseph Sieyes and the American statesman, Thomas Jefferson who in spite of the King's benevolence to the American cause is seen here writing the Rights of the common man as opposed to the monarchial rights of Kings. Serving therefore as a French General in the American War for Independence he commanded the National Guards which protected the Royal Family. Accused of involvement in the foiled escape of the Royal family to Varennes in 1791, and for having ordered his guards to open fire at the Champ de Mars at Jacobins, an unpopular act which removed the possibility of his becoming the Mayor of Paris, which was his dream. A warrant was issued for his arrest but he fled and was captured by Austrian troops. He was imprisoned for five years until Napoleon seized power and he was able to return.

And finally, this is Marie Antoinette, born an Archduchess of Austria, was the Queen of France. Yes, she beautiful indeed. I can hear your silent clamor. As a 14 year-old-teener she is introduced as the Dauphine, and around 50,000 people filled the streets of Paris just to have a glimpse of her. It is true that she will dress up in court but that was the culture in the most magnificent royal court in Europe at that time, the Royal Court of Versailles. Besides, even if she was Queen, the tendency of other noble ladies was to overdress which she never did because her husband the King has already approved her looks. She even had this simple white dress which she prefers to wear. And yet, there are also times when she obliges to the occasion and as a woman tried sometimes new fashion as offered to her. It was unfortunate that courtesans themselves rumor against her as they could not match her very grace.

While the King personally admire her when she opens the gate of Versailles for the hungry, being the one herself helping distribute bread there were untrue stories which circulated. While it was true that at least two predecessors have said the satirical, "Let them eat cake, " she never said anything like that herself for she would just smile at them with compassion not knowing anything to say on how to alleviate their lot.

And here's one that reflects on those sympathetic to the gay cause, \_ The elder priest wanted to emphasize,\_ There was one audacious lesbian noble woman, Noele de Gray du Olva, who would always complement her looks and this the Freemason propagandists took right away as a "fact" that the two were secret lovers. This Noele is in fact a beautiful dead ringer of the queen as they have obvious similarities. Even Gen. Lafayette whom the queen disliked for sometimes preventing her from attending mass or just going around the gardens was made into her amorous overjealous escort, who would not allow other men to come near her making his strict guarding ordered by the King himself grossly misinterpreted. The rumor started even early on when they were so young and married but could not produce an heir. The rumor spread that she needed

other lovers as the King just can't. So that the stories worsened showing that she was indeed profligate, promiscuous and even pervert.

But worst are the stories that some people have to create using her name and character just to dupe others in order to get money. A prostitute by the name of Jeanne de Valois Saint Remy de la Motte and her lover, Retaux de Villete, a soldier, convinced Cardinal Rohan, who was also her former lover, that diamond necklace Louis XV had it made for his mistress, Madame du Barry, before he died of smallpox, would now be available only for a cheaper price of 2,000,000 livres and that when presented to Marie Antoinette by Count Alessandro Cagliostro, she really wanted it. Now, this Cardinal was once the French ambassador to the Austrian court but earned the ire of Queen Maria Theresa, the mother of Marie Antoinette for maligning the two of them. Hence, the Cardinal raised the money to regain the favor of the Queen. Count Cagliostro vouched for the transaction. They even dressed up the lesbian Noele de Gray as the queen herself and made the two met secretly in one of the Versailles gardens since the cardinal confessed his passion for her. Here he even gave the "Queen" a rose and promised to raise the money. Villete forged the Queen's signature for the love notes. The money was raised and the jewelers Boehmer and Bassenge were finally happy to sell the jewels which they actually offered to the queen twice. The first, was as the king's gift to her but she said she rather have the "74s" referring to have ships for the nation than a jewel for herself and second, as a gift when the dauphin was born. The jewels were picked apart and sold by the culprits in the black market. Once exposed, it was found that the Queen had nothing to do with the transaction. It was easy to prove her innocence because she never wrote "of France" after her name while the forged ones showed the words after her name. Villete, the forger was made a galley slave and even the count was exiled while Jeanne de la Motte was whipped and then branded as a thief on both shoulders and jailed in Saltpetriere, from where she escaped disguised as a boy in 1789. She died with an eye cut out with a fractured arm and both legs broken after suffering from a fall and a life as a Russian spy. Apparently, Noele de Gray's posing as the gueen would elucidate why the queen was seen in many compromising situations right in Versailles where the nobles live with the royal family, a spoiling legacy of Louis XIV. The cardinal never made it into a favored life again. Here, the Queen didn't even demand for the capital punishment even if she was advised, but the ugly story remained that she was in fact solicitous of an opulent diamond necklace even when people suffer, from a pious cardinal at that, just for her perfidy.

Rose Ann Migalang, Jennie Masamoc, Joyce Alag and Janis Mendelsohn were in tears and when Ferdie Migalang asked them what was wrong, Rose Ann simply said that they pity the poor queen. Jennie and Janis couldn't speak with the former just blushing red.

Caluag, said, \_This why it is also hard to be in the higher echelons because your tendency is to forget that the higher you go up the greater will be your fall, and I'm not talking about the king and queen here as heaven will surely give them the justice due them someday. I'm speaking about the insatiable revolutionists here. For in the name of liberty they have detained and made captive to their insanity. In the name of equality, they have made so many oppressions and iniquities. And in the name of brotherhood, they have killed their other brothers. And so, let me see your own analyses now. Let us start with you, Fr. Richelieu.

I am surprised at the way Lafayette did things. To think that I admire him before for helping in the American cause. It seems to me, here that he is really an opportunist, he said.

Misty Towers was called and she said, \_ I see again the power of the pen as Marat's newspaper had an effect on the public.

But I guess it's the Freemason propaganda machinery, too.\_ said Nelson Dalisay to which Miss Towers agreed with a nod. Camille Mendoza was in agreement.

When the Rector redirected on the crusades, Platito Toorinkaya opined that they were a waste of logistics; money, time, effort and men. Rico del Sol disagreed as it was the noble cause which pleased God but the other Del Sols, Cari and Arci agreed with the philosopher although the poet was their brother. Rose Ann wondered what is it with the men arguing over spilt milk.

Simon Dolor was scandalized that Robespierre for all his murderous intents as a Jacobin leader could have the audacity to start a religious cult. Ron Mendoza on the other hand, admired Queen Marie Antoinette's devotion to the mass even during hard times. Camille and Rose Ann had the opinion that this and also, Charlemagne's devotion would warrant their canonization someday as prophesied. Fr. Frank just smiled knowing the prophecies.

Although already outlawed, fraternities continue to exist in Philippine schools. This is why victims of hazing who have undergone the so-called legit rites of passage are according to law, victims, even if they have consented to the violence, nobody still has the right to threaten or take away one's life.

And this one is the Tennis Court Oath where deputies to Versailles made them selves into the National Assembly led by Sieyes and Mirabeau. This happened on June 20, 1789.

Because of the rumors fomented by Freemasons from the national assembly unrest follows the dismissal of Finance Minister Jacques Necker which in itself was

made possible by Masonic sympathizers. With civil unrest brewing, the king ordered troops to cordon Versailles while the Bastille was being stormed and mobs rioted in different places. This was July 14, 1789.

This is on August 4, 1789 when the deputies in Versailles abolished feudalism to give in to the demands of the mobs. This time, the nobility realized the cost of their greed when they did not allow a few concessions being asked by the King through Necker.

Here, American ambassador to the French court intervening in French internal affairs stand with Sieyes and Lafayette gloating on their "Declarations of the Rights of Man" insensitive to the generosity of the French King which is mortified in the document. The French aid to the Americans for their independence totaled more than 1.5 billion livres. This was August 26, 1789. The three are covert Freemasons.

This Paris mob orders the King and his family to move into Paris where the people "can watch them" at the instance of the Masons in the national assembly. This happened on October 5, 1789. Ten days later, the national Assembly will dictate the course of the revolution and take over the splendid Versailles for themselves.

Still not contented, the Freemasons representing different sectors of society with caucuses held in different lodges create the Civil Constitution of the Clergy limiting the number of Bishops from 132 to 93; and allowing their selection by the French people instead of the Pope of Rome, and also allowing the selling of church properties to finance government reforms. This occurred on July 12, 1790. As expected, the Pope, Pius VI condemned the act.

As early as April 20, 1791, the Girondists led by Brissot de Warville, ever suspicious of emigres into France, agitated the government to declare war on Austria which they felt was planning to attack France for its treatment of Marie Antoinette. When war ensued and he Austrians were winning, they made up the story that the Queen was passing strategic information to her compatriots. This now, would constitute the reason for a limited monarchy rule. As the threat was growing against them, The King and his family attempted to escape but were discovered. This move prompted the mob to gatecrash into the royal domicile at Tuilleres on August 10, 1792. Unrest followed this event which unfortunately was exploited and the September massacres occurred from the 2nd to the 6th of the same month and year.

The Revolutionary Convention abolished the monarchy on September 21, 1792 and the French republic was born bloody. With the Girondists in power, the King and the Queen were executed a month after, January 21, 1793.

Danton seeing the rise of the bourgeoisie or the middle class in power established the Committee on Public Safety which executed the Girondists. He wanted to end the instability threatening the revolution and justified the reign of terror. Danton himself became a victim of the Reign of Terror he created with Robespierre continuing it with mounting paranoia. Robespierre and his Dictatorship of the Mountain had his fellow Committee of Public Safety executors Hebert and Danton killed. This same Dictatorship replaced officially Christianity by his own cult. As it is, the committee saw to it that no one is safe from public execution. Around 40,000 people were killed because of this

violent episode.

Robespierre himself was overthrown on July 27, 1794 or 9 Thermidor with Napoleon Bonaparte as one of the three consuls of the republic taking over. He was duly executed before he do further harm. A new constitution was drafted on August 22, 1795.

During the Vandemare insurrection in Paris on October 5, 1795, Barras and Napoleon who was starting to be seen as a stabilizing military genius quelled it effectively and ruled the Directory from 1795 to 1799. And with the coup d'etat on November 9, 1799, Napoleon Bonaparte became master of all France.

And so ladies and gentlemen, what can you say about these visions?\_asked the mystic. Fr. Frank called on Rodrigo Diaz who was first to raise his hand.

It is plain to see that godless men have the tendency to kill each other even if they are known to be brothers.\_ he said, \_ For each one of them, one's self is paramount. To each his own.

After him, Rodney Baynosa spoke and he said, \_ I am surprised at the informality of how the French started their National Assembly was a tennis court where the shuttlecock goes back and forth and could well b ominous of the policy decision-making of the First republic.

September 21, 1792 recalls for me September 21, 1972, \_blurted out another silent person in the audience. This time, the Greek philosopher introduced him, Ladies and gentlemen, Tribal Chief Wadi Watkalulu of the Hanunuo Mangyan.

A serious silence followed until Atty. Paz Magtibay spoke. She said, \_ October 31, 1793 is Halloween. On this day, Protestants make their thanksgiving in memory of

Luther's reformation. Any significance why Danton would choose this day to start the Committee on Public Safety?

Now, since you mention that, many of those Girondists executed were still professing Catholics and are therefore threatening to the godless Masonic revolution. In fact, Olymphe de Gouges who authored the 1791 "Declaration of the Rights of Women and the Female Citizens" confessed Catholicism and was for a constitutional monarchy which the radical Jacobins didn't like even as a compromise. She had to die three days after the male Gerondins were guillotined.

But what is a Thermidor? \_asked Misty Towers.

It was as if nature has collaborated against Napoleon and his army. And this is Waterloo, the French put up circles of resistance as the allied forces under the Arthur Wellesley, of Wellington, the Iron Duke, relentlessly attacked them. The tide of war has utterly changed and the French invasion forces, after a long string of victories which expanded the French empire, suffers a decisive defeat. The collaboration of nations against France triumphed. He is exiled to Elba and then makes a comeback only to be defeated in Waterloo.

This is Napoleon during his second exile, this time in St. Helena. And here is the scene when he was already dying as he was poisoned little by little. It was a secret collaboration to ensure that he does not come back to power.

And this is Napoleon III, Napoleon's nephew, a proud man who thought he would have the same luck as Napoleon had. Unfortunately for him, Otto von Bismarck had already unified Germany and the Iron Chancellor himself, was leading the war against Imperial France after luring Napoleon III into the Franco-Prussian war. It was a solid collaboration of the Germanic people against France.

Napoleon III is humiliated. Alsace-Lorraine is occupied by the Germans to the shame of the French because it is the land of the Maid of Orleans, St. Joan of Arc, the national hero. In the search for a new national leadership, representatives to the National Assembly, since they are still composed of many loyalists to the monarchy,

collaborated in their decision to invite the most eminent heir to become King. The choice was henry, the count of Chambord.

By this time, Our Lady has already appeared in La Salette to two shepherds, Melanie Calvat and Maximin Giraud. Along with her unique appearance she brought with her sad tidings and warning against man's apostasy and materialism. By April of 1945, the French collaborators in the Sigmaringen Enclave had already been rounded up. This last scene shows French prostitutes and collaborator women being paraded with shaved heads. I just don't understand, \_said Robert Besana, \_Hitler used to paint? An artist should have a sensitive soul why then the holocausts? And Petain, a hero?

And what an ingrate!\_ exclaimed Zaida Tolentino, \_ He was supported by Jews before?

Yes, you are right. But remember that artists being emotionally-laden can be that harsh to others, too. Remember that Nero, the Roman emperor was a musicologist and a thespian. Marshall Petain's being hero had nothing to do with his being a puppet next for a person can change allegiance and therefore character. Let's not be far-sighted and be more foresighted as this can again happen in the future. Take a look at our own history. 
The Frenchman was awful as he didn't know about these things, too even if he was a priest himself.
